Morning Star Higher Secondary School, Gudalur is the only CBSE Co-Educational School in located in the verdant hills of the Nilgiris. This institution, a haven for students was established by the CMI fathers of the St. Thomas Province under the visionary ethos of St Kuriakose Elais Chavara. A separate kindergarten section takes special care of the tiny tots with excellent facilities including a beautiful park. At present the Nursery school has 260 Students supported by a team of 16 staff members which include 12 dedicated teachers and 4 supporting staff.

The high school has a large sports ground and takes pride in being a plastic free zone. The campus is well maintained ensuring a clean and tidy environment for students to learn and grow. We are proud to present the annual report which reflects the mile stone that we had achieved.

It has been standing strong for 31 years. Now the school has 279 tiny stars, 11 teachers and 3 non teaching staff. It's a jewel in the crown of the CMI institution with good infrastructure to cater for an excellence in education.
